TRAIL GUIDELINES

I was asked to send remind all trail users about the guidelines we have in place for the Dapplegray Lanes trails. Here are the basics:

1) Wednesdays and Thursdays are the days for hay deliveries and manure pick up. No other use is authorized on these days, including any construction, tree trimming, etc. Any other use of the trail requires a request and approval of the DLPOA Board.


You can send a request to

Most requests are approved, and we do ask that, if possible, please schedule any work that requires the use of the trails on Wednesdays and Thursdays as riders are already expecting some vehicles or additional activity so it won't be a surprise. We also send out these reminders to all DLPOA members and nonresident members who utilize the trails and private arena to help spread the word.



2) No bicycles, strollers, e-bikes, motorized vehicles, golf carts, etc., are allowed on the trails. The trails are for horses, riders and pedestrians only. We do have some smaller motorized vehicles and tractors that access from time to time for maintenance and inspection, but try to give notice of those and also try to limit to Wednesdays and Thursdays.





Thank you to everyone who helped make the Lanes the most magical place to be this Holiday Season!






